1A. SURVIVING AN OSHA INSPECTION
 The first 15 minutes of an OSHA inspection will provide the framework and primary resources to decipher the nature of compliance. Related to clarifying the actual due process requirements of the Cal/OSHA Program, the second part will focus on the "REAL" and functional intent of the injury and illness prevention program.
